Wendy Paterson, Dean of the School of Education

Dean Paterson talked about what is going on in the organization, how the organization relates to SUNY and New York State as a whole. She went on to talk about how structure and intentionally are the keys to the success of the partnership with Buffalo State and its surrounding districts. As a result, Buffalo State has been able to build the longest-lasting, largest, and most well-developed clinically rich practice in all of NYS. She emphasized the importance of creating PD by asking neighboring school districts what they want skillset teachers to have when working at a school district. She also pointed out how far this organization has expanded to multiple departments on campus over the years.

- III. New business: Partnership and collaboration
 - A. All Hands On Deck Initiative for 2021-2022

- This is a new collaborative initiative among all who offer professional development that came from needs from our PDS stakeholders.
- This initiative will go for two weeks with live sessions starting on August 23rd
- One purpose of this initiative is to help prepare teacher candidates who are student teaching in fall 2021 and ensure that they are ready to work with P-12 leaners
- The model of this initiative is adopted from the book *Rebound* by Doug Fisher et al. This book emphasizes learning acceleration rather than focusing on learning loss.
- Each session will be held synchronously and available asynchronously in an online format.
- Improving student achievement through accelerated learning, equity, and social justice, social and emotional learning, classroom management, strategies, co-teaching, and literacy and math support are some of the many topics being presented in this initiative.

III. CAEP

- A. Survey response rates (Tiffany Fuzak)
 - Each year students graduating take an exit survey. In this survey, there is a space where they can put another email other than their Buffalo State email.
 - A year later, these alumni are emailed another survey called alumni 1.1
 - Then three years after this, alumni are sent a survey called alumni 1.3
 - These surveys ask questions about where the alumni work
 - Finally, a survey is sent via email to the employer of the alumni and has questions directed about that person
 - Response rates are at the 10-15%
 - Currently, the only means of sending out the surveys is through email.
 - Ideas/question to increase survey participation are the following:
 - o Emails are sent to every email address that the alumni have on file
 - Surveys sent through email contain information on the purpose/importance of the survey

- o The surveys are sent at the end of the semester
- O Surveys can be sent more than once over the course of the year
- o Emails should be sent by snail mail along with email
- Use current students to help with delivering the surveys to the administration at the school
- Tie the PDS conference to helping with participation with the survey
- Have student/Buffalo State staff in the PDS school interview the principal of that school
