## SUNY Buffalo State English Education



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### Program Overview

**PDS Center for Teaching and Learning** is a Professional Development Schools Consortium (PDS) internship program for Buffalo State teacher candidates. It includes participation in pre-travel meetings during September and October and an immersive 1-week internship at the Center for Teaching and Learning (CTL) in Edgecomb, Maine in mid-October.

The CTL (<http://c-t-l.org/>) is a K-8 independent demonstration school that focuses on workshop approaches to literacy learning, small class sizes, respect for children, relationships of trust between faculty and parents, and programs that engage and prepare students for life. CTL was founded by Buffalo State alumna and *Global Teacher Prize* winner, Nancie Atwell, one of the most respected educators in the US and across the world. Nancie's classic *In the Middle*, now in its third edition, has inspired generations of teachers; in it she describes her teaching journey and innovative reading and writing workshop practices that transform elementary and secondary classrooms. The CTL is certified by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges and draws from nearly twenty towns and villages to create a loving, close-knit community of students and families.

Participants engage in a workshop-based internship where they will observe classrooms at CTL, collaborate with CTL teachers and students, and learn from school administrators and curricular leaders about the cutting-edge cross-curricular literacy practices at CTL. Prior to travel, participants will read Atwell's seminal work, *In the Middle*, to explore the workshop model and prepare for clinical experiences and discussions at CTL. Research opportunities at the school are also available for interested participants. In addition, participants will explore the quaint towns of coastal Maine, attend a group dinner in Booth's Bay, and stay at a local inn.

Participants pay a fee to cover program costs, lodging, and meals. Travel costs (9.5 hr drive or flight) must be paid separately.

**Eligibility** Open to all undergraduate and graduate teacher candidates. Best fit for junior or higher.

**Requirements** Must be a currently enrolled Buffalo State student.  
Must maintain good academic standing.

- Typed Statement of Intent (in response to provided prompts)  
- Copy of grades and registration (transcript, Degree Works, Banner)

**To Participate** Selected participants must submit all final payments by the deadlines specified, complete required paperwork and processes, participate in the pre-travel meetings, and adhere to all travel guidelines.

**STATEMENT OF INTENT** – Submit a typed response of no more than 500 words to the following prompts. Be thorough so reviewers can get a clear picture of your interest and intent with regards to this program.

- (1) What do you hope to gain from this program professionally/academically and personally? How you plan to integrate your experiences into your teaching?
- (2) What do you hope to bring to the program (our hosts, the children in the schools, your peers, etc.)?
- (3) What characteristics and experiences will help you be successful in this program? What are your interests? What are your strengths and challenges? How do you handle stressful situations?
